Guest Minister The Rev. Kathleen Walton was born in Aberdeen, Scotland and grew up in southern Ontario in the 50's and 60's. She attended McMaster University for a degree in Anthropology, and then worked for several years as a librarian at York University in the Government Documents Dept. of the Library. The call of the north in the 70's took her to Whitehorse, Yukon, supposedly for a year or so, but the call went deeper than that and she stayed in Whitehorse working first for the Indian Affairs Dept. and then the Territorial Government Economics Dept. She married Tom Walton in 1980 and they lived on a small hobby farm and horse rescue operation near the Takhini Hot Springs until 1991, when they both felt the call to another life, and attended Queen's University to study Theology. The United Church has been Kathy's faith home for most of her life and she has served churches in Plevna, Frankford, Seeley's Bay, Athens, Westbrook, and Grace United, in Gananoque. In Retirement, serving as a Supply Minister has introduced her to the life and struggles of many local congregations. She continues to believe that pastoral care for congregation and community is the core quality that reveals the depth of commitment to gospel values and feeds the spiritual life of all.

• A seven-session study based on the video "Doctrine of Discovery: Stolen Lands, Strong Hearts" will take place Wednesdays, May 5 - June 16, 7:00-8:30 pm, via Zoom. This video describes the history behind the Doctrine of Discovery, a set of beliefs and legal framework that led to European Colonization of the Americas. Through interviews with Indigenous and non-Indigenous people, the video documents how the doctrine informed centuries of racist policies and practices – and how Canada must transcend its lingering effects to achieve healing and reconciliation. If you would like to experience the awesome experience that playing the pipe organ can afford, you may be interested to know that the Royal Canadian College of Organists (RCCO), Kingston Centre offers scholarships for talented pianists of all ages who would like to be introduced to and develop their playing skills on the pipe organ. Scholarships provide 10 hours of free organ lessons with a qualified instructor. Auditions for qualified applicants will be held by Zoom.

The Kingston Centre receives financial support for these scholarships from the National RCCO office, local individuals and churches, and raises funds by sponsoring centre events. Each student has the opportunity to perform in the student concert in late-winter and is invited to attend all local RCCO events.
