LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE



Brigitta and Monika Holzschuh But the angel said to the shepherds, "Do not be afraid for I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign

for you; you will find a child wrapped in bonds of cloth and lying in a manger." (Luke2:19-12). The third candle of Advent symbolizes **JOY**. This candle reminds us of the joy of the shepherds who journeyed to see Jesus in Bethlehem, even before the wise men arrived. This candle is called the **Shepherds candle**, and its color is pink, the liturgical color for joy.
