ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF THE LAND

The lands on which we are gathering today are the traditional territories of the Anishinaabe and Haudenosaunee Peoples. LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE Introduction to Advent Candle celebration for 2023

The word "Advent" means "a coming, an approach, an arrival." Advent has to do with a journey toward Bethlehem in which we have the opportunity to be drawn by the Light of God come among us in the person of the babe of Bethlehem. The circular shape of the Advent wreath symbolizes God's infinite and never-ending love for us.

The four candles of Advent represent the themes of the four Sundays of Advent – Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. A fifth candle in the middle of the wreath represents the birth of Jesus.

The first candle of Advent represents **HOPE**. The first candle is purple in color, symbolizing a royalty that chooses to serve rather than be served.

Sometimes also referred to as a **Prophecy Candle**, it reminds us of Isaiah's testimony to the birth of Jesus and all the promises in the Old Testament Jesus fulfilled. As we light this candle, we are reminded of a hope that has stood the test of time.
