THANK YOU FOR TALENTS SHARED

Guest Minister Rev. Wendy MacLean was ordained in 1997 and settled to a ministry of Christian nurture and spirituality at Queen Street United Church in Kingston. Over her years of ministry, working with small spirituality groups has been a highlight. In 2003, she moved to the Eastern Townships, Quebec, to the Cowansville Pastoral Charge.

She has never been in a congregation that was not in transition of some sort, and her interest in emerging models of ministry led to her next appointment as Vision and Transformation Minister with Montreal Presbytery. After serving in this creative role, she returned to Ontario to a small rural charge in Lyn, Ontario. Wendy retired from congregational ministry in July 2021, to take up a new ministry of Spiritual Direction.

Wendy's roots with Chalmers go back to her grandmother, who was active in the work of the church from 1942 until she was unable to attend in person (in the 1970's) The radio broadcast was a godsend for her, and she regularly showed Wendy the Chalmers newsletters and copies of sermons from Lois Wilson. When Wendy's parents, Jean and Doug MacLean, retired to Kingston, they both took active roles in leadership at Chalmers.

Wendy is an award-winning poet and lyricist, with works commissioned and sung by choirs internationally. She has been thrilled to see her collaborations with Mark Sirett sung by the Cantabile Choirs. She is looking forward to the publication of her third book of poetry, *On Small Wings* sometime this year.
