

One: As we gather in worship today we are reminded afresh of the inclusive love of God that such cruelty offends, a love that arouses our compassion, and our anger and calls us to action.

All: Remind us in our worship of what it is that makes for peacemaking and inspire the will and wisdom to find a way.

CENTERING PRAYER

Today we give thanks for the opportunity to give expression to the inner struggles aroused by the suffering of the victims of war. Awaken us afresh to the love Jesus lived that prevails in the midst of violence and gives the strength and companionship to find a way in the wilderness of suffering. We pray for courage for our leaders to choose the way of peace-making and to have the strength to persevere. As we as a congregation, journey through a time where we are being called to search out a way to bear witness to the love of God in our own community inspire us to see and help us to respond. Assure us that we do not walk alone in the search and in the decison-making. Remind us each step of the way that we are anchored by a Spirit that has weathered many challenges and can see us through to a new day. Amen.
